# Natural Wastewater Treatment Systems



For many small communities, natural treatment systems are a viable, low-cost, effective means of treating wastewater. A properly constructed treatment system that is designed to work with the local topography has many advantages including: a high level of treatment, low operational expenses, low construction costs, reduced or eliminated odor problems, handling of varying wastewater loadings, reduced land costs for land application of wastewater, aesthetic appeal, and providing wildlife habitat.

Join Lincoln Hills RC&D and The Nature Conservancy at the 2010 Natural Treatment System workshop and find out if natural treatment systems are right for you and your community!

Ms. Debbie Barnhizer, Indiana State Department of Health, will discuss the **advantages of natural treatment systems**, take the group on a **'virtual field trip'** to communities throughout Indiana that are utilizing natural treatment systems, and give beginners some **do's and don'ts** learned through experiences around the state.

Ms. Barnhizer has 21 years of experience in the public health field with the past 13 years working with the State Department of Health in the onsite sewage disposal program.
